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AUDITOR GENERALS REPORT ON COVID-19 EXPENDITURE SHOULD NOT BECOME ANOTHER AUDIT REPORT: HEADS MUST ROLL.

SEND Ghana has observed with keen interest continuous media reportage on the Auditor General's report regarding the misappropriation of funds mobilised by the government of Ghana to fight the Covid-19 pandemic. Multiple reports suggest that a substantial part of the COVID-19 funds have been grossly misapplied and channelled to fund other government interventions and flagship programs. It is sad to note that out of nearly Gh¢22 billion that was raised to fight the COVD-19 pandemic between March 2020 to June 2022, just a little over half (Gh¢12 billion) was used to fight the pandemic and its related impact. The misapplication and mismanagement of these funds directly contravenes and/or violates the Public Financial Management Act, 2016 (Act 921) which was instituted to regulate public sector spending.

In April 2022, SEND GHANA called on the Supreme Audit Institutions, the Auditor General Department and the Parliament of Ghana to as part of their oversight role conduct special audit into COVID-19 related expenditures to ensure value for money. Consequently, we highly commend the Auditor General for heeding our call and been bold and decisive. Whiles commending the auditor general for revealing the rot in the COVID-19 expenditures, we wish to emphasise that this should not be just another audit report. Heads must roll. We urge the Auditor General to surcharge and prosecute all persons and entities found culpable. The Public Accounts Committee of Parliament should as a matter of urgency also prioritise sitting on the report and take the necessary action and ensure heads role immediately. The courts must also be proactive and not overly delay in the prosecution of those found culpable, as has been the case in most grand corruption cases involving public officials. This should not be just another audit report.

Heads must roll.
