



Executive Summary

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- An opinion poll by Global InfoAnalytics in six constituencies with significant Zongo communities, purposefully selected, shows John Dramani Mahama (JDM) leading his closest rivels, Dr Mahamudu Bawumia (DMB) and Alan Kyeremanten (AKK) by huge margin. The poll shows JDM leads with 73.1%, DMB, 22.2% and AKK, 2.5 and 2.5% are undecided.
- ☐ When voters were asked what in their view divides Ghanaians, 63% said politics, 20% said ethnicity and 17% said religion.
- On the question of whether ethnicity or religion would influence how electorates would vote in 2024, 84% said religion is unlikely to influence their choice while 16% said it is likely to influence them. On religion, 85% said it is unlikely to influence them while 15% said it is likely to influence them.
- ☐ On which of the policies of the various campaign teams have caught their attention and would influence how they vote, 71% said the 24 hrs economy policy proposal, 20%mentioned the digitisation drive, 3% said the Great Transformation Plan and 6% said none of the policies caught their attention.

Methodology and Approach:




- ☐ Sample size: 2,745 were interviewed with
- □ Confidence level: 99% and MoE of ±2.41%
- ☐ The Electoral Commission's 2020 voters register was used as sample frame.
- ☐ A sample of constituencies with significant Zongo communities were selected purposefully for this poll
- ☐ The results are based on "likely voters" model (both registered and unregistered voters) and exclude responses of voters who have indicated that they will not vote.
- ☐ The general elections polls are presented unweighted
- ☐ The following constituencies were polled
 - Ayawaso East (Greater Accra)
 - Ayawaso North (Greater Accra)
 - Ayawaso Central (Greater Accra)
 - Ablekuma Central (Greater Accra
 - Madina (Greater Accra)
 - Ashaiman (Greater Accra)
 - Asawase (Ashanti)
- ☐ Demographic analysis of the results would have higher margin of error.
- ☐ Field interviews were conducted between 23rd November to 28th November 2023.















How do you describe your standard of living in the last 12 months




Optimism for improvement in standard of living –Next 12 months


























2020 Elections vs 2024 Voting Intensions




How they voted 2020 General Election



How 2020 voters intend to vote in 2024




How likely would you change your mind about your voting intentions?




Influence of Ethnicity & Religion



How Likely would the Ethnicity of the Candidates Influence your vote?




How Likely would the Religion of the Candidates Influence your vote?


